#### 1. NON-RESOLUTION BOARD ITEMS

President Scott Savage called the meeting to order at 8:34 a.m.

Mr. Savage led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 2. CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

Mr. Fritz Byers proposed an amendment to the consent agenda stating that the meeting will cover everything on the agenda; however, the timing of the items will be adjusted due to scheduling and may have to change the order. Subject to that description, Mr. Byers made a motion to approve the consent agenda, as amended, including the disposition of the minutes for the regular Board meeting held on June 22, 2022. This motion was seconded by Mrs. Doneghy and approved.

#### 3. CONSIDERATION OF REPORTS FROM DIRECTOR AND EMPLOYEES OF THE PARK DISTRICT FOR REVIEW

A. Public Space: Art, Nature and Community – Marc Folk, President and CEO, The Arts Commission

Mr. Savage introduced Mr. Marc Folk, executive director of The Arts Commission, stating that Metroparks has enjoyed a long and successful partnership with the organization. Mr. Folk acknowledged Nathan Mattimoe, Art in Public Places Director, who is responsible for much of the art being presented today.

Mr. Folk's presentation pertained specifically to one of the Commission's pillars, public art. He went on to share that when public art is done right, it connects with people. Since the pandemic, The Arts Commission has strived to deepen its work with an emphasis on diversity, equity and inclusion, which is aligned with Metroparks vision and strategic plan.

Mr. Folk stated that as Metroparks Toledo continues to develop Glass City Metropark, The Arts Commission has begun to design and develop its work around this progress. One area in particular is focusing on the neighborhoods surrounding Glass City Metropark. This allows for an opportunity to build upon the connectivity within these neighborhoods. One example of how the Arts Commission has engaged young artists to design signal box wraps with flora and fauna designs in downtown neighborhoods.

He added that the Commission has also engaged artists to create murals, also with flora and fauna themes, along the Maumee River corridor in downtown Toledo.

He also cited the Glass City River Wall project on a bank of silos along the river, which has attracted national attention as the largest mural in the United States. It has a nature and Native American theme.

Mr. Folk made the comparison of the Maumee River's bridges to that of bookends in connection to the Glass City Riverwalk. The addition of lights to both the Anthony Wayne Bridge and the Veterans Glass City Skyway to activate the I280 Bridge has enhanced the city skyline.

One project currently underway is the Glass City Center, includes activating spaces by installing lightbox art by Cable Griffith based no images of six Metroparks selected from among 700 received in a public outreach effort the Arts Commission and Metroparks Toledo.

Mr. Folk shared that work has begun with Metroparks Toledo on the history of the Glass City Metropark site in East Toledo, which involves "Clinkers" discovered during construction. The Arts Commission and Metroparks Toledo are working with a local shop, Graphite Design + Build, to restore these relics of the riverfront's industrial past and incorporate them into the park's design. Another installation, the Beacon (also known as the Ghost Tower), will use glass to pay homage to smokestacks that were once prominent on the site. Artist Bryony Roberts will be installing a sculpture made of lighted glass globes near the riverfront in Glass City Metropark. Metroparks Toledo and ProMedica have also partnered with The Arts Commission to memorialize the COVID-19 pandemic with a Sculpture on International Hill, a new area of International Park.

Mr. Byers thanked Mr. Folk on behalf of the Metroparks Toledo Board of Park Commissioners for what they have done. He went on to point out how closely aligned Metroparks Toledo and The Arts Commission are in the work that we all do. Art and nature have been inseparably intertwined and integral to Metroparks Toledo's goals of preservation and conservation. He referenced a quote from artist Thomas Merton, who once stated that what can be said about nature, can often be sad of art. Art enables us to discover ourselves and lose ourselves, much like Metroparks Toledo's tagline of Get Outside Yourself, Mr. Byers continued.

Ms. Luetke shared her admiration for The Arts Commission. When she encounters someone who is new to the area or has moved back to the region, she said the number one thing to do is to visit the Metroparks and get involved with the arts community. Toledo, she said, is rich with arts and creativity, on par with much larger

communities, she added. Ms. Luetke said she takes pride in The Arts Commission and all of the opportunities in the works with Metroparks Toledo. She shared that she is aware how hard the staff works to be thought leaders in this space, especially involving youth.

Dave Zenk said that The Arts Commission is one of Metroparks Toledo's strongest partners. He said the Arts Commission's ability to embrace public spaces creates unique features. Mr. Zenk thanked Mr. Folk for everything the he and the Commission do, and for their partnerships. Mr. Folk agreed that shared values is vital.

#### 4. BOARD APPROVAL OF CONTRACTS, DEEDS, AGREEMENTS, ETC.

A. Mr. Byers offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Mrs. Doneghy:

#### Resolution No. 44-22 - Resolution of Necessity

Mr. Cleland stated that in order to align and prepare Metroparks Toledo for the levy renewal in November, 2022, Lucas County Auditor Anita Lopez and Mr. Matt Thal were in attendance to certify rates and amounts.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

Ms. Luetke made a motion to recess for Lucas County Auditor Anita Lopez to certify rates and amounts, Mrs. Doneghy seconded, motion approved.

Mr. Byers expressed his appreciation to Lucas County Auditor Anita Lopez and her team for being present to sign documents necessary to place a levy renewal on the November ballot. He went on to state that the board's approval of the Notice to Proceed is vital to placing the renewal on the ballot, which he said is necessary for the park system to achieve its goals for all parks, including the riverfront project.

B. Mr. Byers offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Ms. Luetke:

#### 4. CONSIDERATION OF REPORTS FROM DIRECTOR AND EMPLOYEES OF THE PARK DISTRICT FOR REVIEW CONTINUED

A. Youth Development Program Overview – Felica Clark, Director of Diversity, Equity & Inclusion

Ms. Felica Clark provided an overview of a new pilot program being offered by Metroparks Toledo regarding youth development and leadership training. The main purpose is to provide exposure, develop interest and

ultimately retention for careers at Metroparks Toledo. All of the attendees have said they will definitely return based on this experience. Ms. Clark had each of the youth introduce themselves and what they have enjoyed so far within the program:

- Dan Raney 16 years, junior at Scott High School and has really enjoyed seeing all of the different parks.
   He has never visited Metroparks Toledo.
- Keyon Holston 17 years, senior at St. Francis and his favorite part has been learning about all of the different fields.
- Amir Easterly 17 years, senior at St. Francis and has enjoyed learning new things.

Mr. Zenk said it was important to thank the Metroparks Toledo Foundation for provide funding to allow for this pilot program.

Mrs. Doneghy said it is just so wonderful to have the community youth involved to learn what Metroparks Toledo is all about.

Ms. Leutke shared that obtaining their perspective and their feedback is very important to continue the growth of this program.

Mr. Savage thanked Ms. Clark for her energy and demonstrating her leadership in this space.

- B. Treasurer's Report Matt Cleland, Chief Financial Officer/Treasurer
  - Mr. Matt Cleland introduced Ms. Rachael Champion as a new accountant for Metroparks Toledo.
  - Mr. Cleland went on to share that everything is trending as we have expected with nothing additional to add.

Mrs. Doneghy inquired about the "Then and Now" report. Mr. Cleland reported that the Lathrop contract is very large and the timing of these payments have been just ahead of it and Metroparks Toledo is allocating the funds when able to. The entry of the purchase order was just behind the approval date; consequently, Lathrop is doing the work and sending their invoices. In this particular instance, the appropriation was not available in the proper account at that time of the work.

Mr. Savage inquired about interest earnings on bond proceeds, how does that get tracked? Mr. Cleland stated he is inquiring with bond counsel to determine all allowable options for investment of these funds. He went on to say that we are not allowed to benefit from arbitrage. In order to track interest earnings and expense, Mr. Cleland has placed the proceeds in a separate bank account and categorized them in a separate bank within the finance software system. The interest received goes directly into this account and can also track our earnings. Mr. Cleland hopes to invest these funds further, even if we have to give back some of the earnings, pending direction from bond counsel.

Mrs. Doneghy inquired about the two trainings. Mr. Cleland responded that the purchase order was not in place when service was received and that he is making it an initiative to reduce then and now certification.

C. Mrs. Doneghy offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Ms. Luetke:

Resolution No. 41-22 – Approval of Supplement and Amendment of the 2022 Certificate of Estimated Resources and Appropriations Measure

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

D. Ms. Luetke offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Mr. Byers:

#### Resolution No. 42-22 – Transfers from General Fund to Capital Construction and Education Funds

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

E. Mr. Byers offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Mrs. Doneghy:

#### Resolution No. 43-22 – Ratification of Schedule of Payables

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

Mrs. Doneghy stated that it is important that the community is aware that this is not a new levy, but a renewal to continue to support Metroparks Toledo.

F. Mrs. Doneghy offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Mr. Byers:

### Resolution No. 46-22 – Request Approval for Purchase of (1) 2022 Bobcat UW56 ToolCat and (1) Bobcat T66 Track Loader

Ms. Lisa Whitton shared that the ToolCat will be utilized at Glass City Metropark because it has wheels and works well on pavement. The Track Loader is a replacement for the one currently at Secor Metropark. Both of these pieces of equipment did not require a bidding process because of the national sourcing pricing.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

G. Mr. Byers offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Ms. Luetke:

#### Resolution No. 47-22 – Authorization to Apply to the American Rescue Plan Act Funding

Mr. Allen Gallant shared that last year the City of Toledo submitted for this funding last year. As the process moves forward, additional supporting documents are needed and this is documentation that is following along with the process. Mr. Savage inquired if there is a Metroparks Toledo matching component for this particular funding. Mr. Gallant said that no, there is not.

Mr. Byers stated that it is important to note that the City of Toledo has been an invaluable partnership in all of their support. The Mayor and City Council have been just incredible through this project. Mr. Zenk stated that this partnership is very important because there will be future collaboration within the realm of conservation.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

H. Ms. Luetke offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Mr. Byers:

Resolution No. 48-22 – Authorization to Request Funding Through the United States Environmental Protection Agency

Mr. Gallant said the focus of these projects is to address the loss of aquatic habitat. Dr. Tim Schetter shared that these will be design build projects and will take roughly three years to complete.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

Mr. Savage said he can only imagine all of the work that goes into putting these together and thanked all of those who are involved.

I. Mrs. Doneghy offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Ms. Luetke:

#### Resolution No. 49-22 - Ratification of Land Purchase: Marina District Lot 3, 0 Riverside Drive

Dr. Schetter shared that the soil is poor and this will aid in the restoration of that soil.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

J. Mr. Byers offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Ms. Luetke:

#### Resolution No. 50-22 – Ratification of Land Purchase: Marina District Lot 4, 0 Riverside Drive

Dr. Schetter stated that this is a significant purchase to enhance the entrance to Glass City Metropark. While there is no specific plan, there is a need to protect the entrance to the park. Mr. Byers stated that ProMedica has been a tremendous partner throughout this project and that this is the latest reflection of this partnership.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

K. Ms. Luetke offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Mrs. Doneghy:

#### Resolution No. 51-22 - Ratification of Land Purchase: 3909 South Berkey Southern Road

Dr. Schetter shared that there are 30 acres on this property and is considered a hidden gem in the Oak Openings Region. Last winter, Ms. Karen Menard discovered four state listed rare species. Additionally, this is part of the Clean Ohio fund with 75% of costs being refunded from this fund.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

Mr. Savage inquired if there will be any activation on this site. Dr. Schetter responded that at this point, there are no plans for immediate activation.

L. Mr. Byers offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Mrs. Doneghy:

#### Resolution No. 52-22 – Ratification of Land Purchase: 11219 Frankfort Road

Dr. Schetter shared that this is another Clean Ohio fund purchase, with a proximity along two drainage ways and is critical to protect and restore the land. Reforesting the property will take place next spring with the goal being to leverage the Clean Ohio money and the federal funding received.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

Mr. Savage shared that the ability to utilize outside funding for these opportunities, represents our continued efforts to leverage these dollars on the State and federal levels which is integral to our growth of our park system.

M. Mr. Byers offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Mrs. Doneghy:

#### Resolution No. 53-22 – Purchase Approval, Glass City Metropark Furnishings

Mr. Brad Hooven shared that this will include internal and external furnishings for Glass City Phase 2. The contractor will be responsible for delivery, coordination and storage as well as procurement. Mr. Byers asked if we had worked with this contractor prior. Mr. Hooven share that we have not; however, this is a contact that Mr. Calvin Brown had made for us.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

N. Mrs. Doneghy offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Mr. Byers:

Resolution No. 54-22 — Ratification and Approval, Hazardous Materials Abatement Services, Glass City Enrichment Center

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

O. Mrs. Doneghy offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Ms. Luetke:

#### Resolution No. 55-22 – Approval of Design and Installation of Art at Glass City Metropark

Mr. Jon Zvanovec shared that this continues our relationship with Graphite Design and includes light fixtures and the design of sizeable frogs for the site.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

P. Ms. Luetke offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Mr. Byers:

#### Resolution No. 56-22 – Authorization to Commit Local Funds, Glass City Riverwalk BUILD Project

Ms. Jen Van Horn stated that this will secure the ODOT funding and that the increase in costs is due to the soil reports and labor costs. She went on to share that it is important to note that our contractors are within 2% of costs and that the price of lumber is up 60% and steel is up 124% since April, 2021, which is also having an impact. Ms. Luetke inquired as to how this impacts our budget. Mr. Cleland responded that while there is inflation, the BUILD grant portion of the Riverwalk has grown in scope and scale and is now completing a bigger portion of the Riverwalk. Metroparks Toledo will be completing more of the Glass City Riverwalk than originally planned for the BUILD portion; however, the Riverwalk is still a \$150M project, with this now being approximately one third of it. Ms. Luetke noted because we're seeing the increases, having these costs in the budget now helps to avoid inflation in the next few years.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

Q. Mrs. Doneghy offered and moved for adoption of the following resolution, with a second by Ms. Luetke:

Resolution No. 57-22 — Approval of Agreement with Arts Commission of Greater Toledo for Design and Installation of Custom Art Feature at Glass City Metropark

Mrs. Van Horn shared this is a request with The Arts Commission to work with the Bryony light project. Ms. Luetke inquired about who is in charge of the actual glass pieces and community outreach. The Arts Commission will be in charge of it, and will work with Metroparks Toledo staff to engage the local neighborhoods. Mr. Matt Killam said that later this year the community will be celebrating the year of the glass, of which this will be a part of. The Arts Commission is just as passionate with community outreach, much like Metroparks Toledo. Mr. Savage said that this project is first of its kind in the world with 175 stories being told in each of these globes, which will include a QR code to learn the history in this space. Mrs. Ally Effler stated that the foundation is really excited to partner in this because engaging the community is so important.

After discussion and upon unanimous vote the resolution was declared duly adopted and recorded in the appendix to these minutes.

#### 1. Revenues, Expenditures and Changes in Fund Balances – Budget vs. Actual – General Fund as of 07/31/2022

<u>Description</u>: This report is a comparison of the General Fund budgeted revenues, expenditures and transfers compared to actual revenues, expenditures and transfers by month as well as year-end. The approved 2021 general operating fund budget and actual cash basis revenues, expenditures and transfers are represented. Year to date budget distribution is based upon a 12 month proration with the exception of salaries and fringe benefits. Salary and fringe benefit budget distribution is based upon a proration of 26 pay dates. (See Appended Statement – Attachment A).

<u>Current State</u>: Salary and fringe benefits in July are significantly higher than previous months. This is a function of increases in wages and associated retro-active payments that followed the settlement of the collective bargaining agreement.

#### 2. Receipts, Disbursements and Changes in Fund Balances – Budget vs. Actual – All Funds as of 07/31/2022

<u>Description</u>: This report is a comparison of annual budgeted receipts and disbursements compared to cash basis actuals as of month end. The General, Education/Programming and Capital Construction funds are presented as individual columns. The "Grant Funds", "Land Acquisition/Development" and "All Other Funds" columns are each summaries of multiple funds. The far right column is a total of all funds. General fund budget and actual numbers presented in this report are consistent with those presented in the report listed above. (See Appended Statement -- Attachment B).

**Current State**: All Funds BVA is trending as expected through the month of June.

#### 3. Fund Advances Report – All Funds as of 07/31/2022

**<u>Description</u>**: This is a report of inter-fund, Board approved advances activity. Advances are made to support reimbursement grants and activities that would otherwise result in negative fund balances. Advances are returned following the receipt of grant reimbursement revenue.

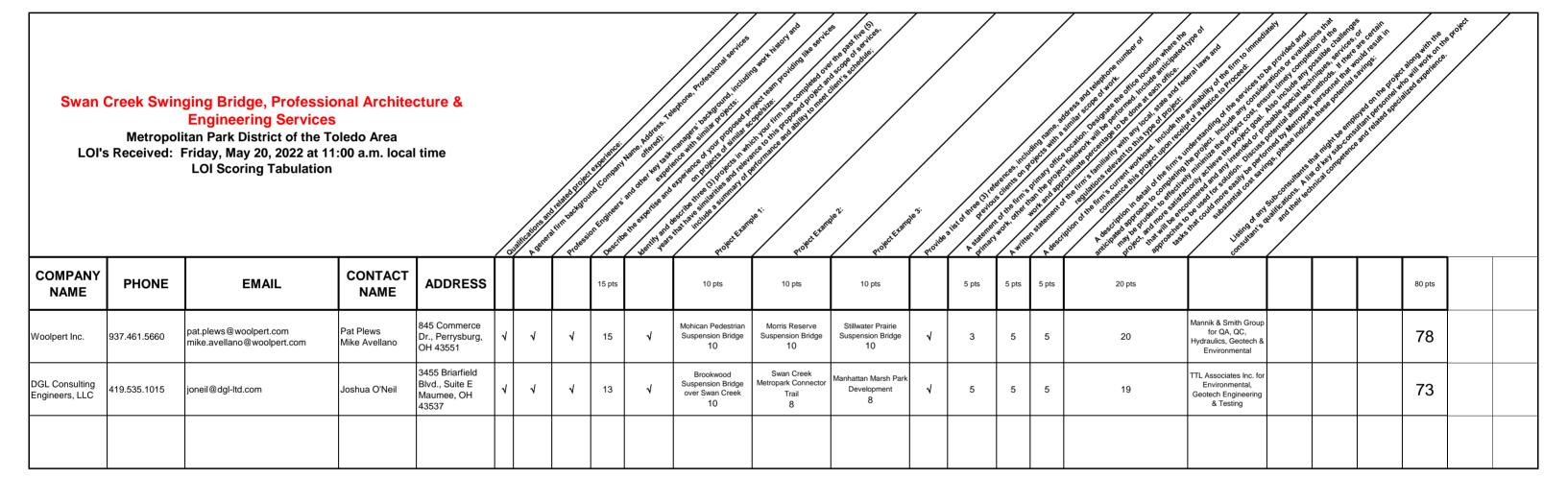

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

Sealed Proposals for Professional Rink Management Services for the Glass City Ice Ribbon were received Friday, July 8, 2022 at 11:00 a.m. One (1) Proposal was received from Rink Management Services Corporation (RMSC) of Virginia. RMSC has been determined by staff to be uniquely qualified to provide the required professional services based upon its submitted Proposal.

The scope of work consists of planning, operating, producing, directing and providing all services, labor and materials necessary for the successful operation of the Glass City Ice Ribbon. The initial performance period shall be for two (2) years, with the right to renew for successive years.

The total cost of professional services for the initial performance period ("Total Cost") is anticipated not-to-exceed \$400,000. The Total Cost includes a monthly management fee of \$11,850 plus the actual labor cost of RMSC's on-site team which consists of one (1) On-Site General Manager, one (1) Shift Manager/Ice Resurfacer, two (2) Admissions, three (3) Skate Rental, and three (3) Skate Hosts during peak usage. The first (soft opening) public season is anticipated from December 29, 2022 – February 10, 2023. The second (full) public season is anticipated from November 8, 2023 – February 23, 2024.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Approve a professional services contract with Rink Management Services Corporation, for an amount not-to-exceed \$400,000 for a two year term.

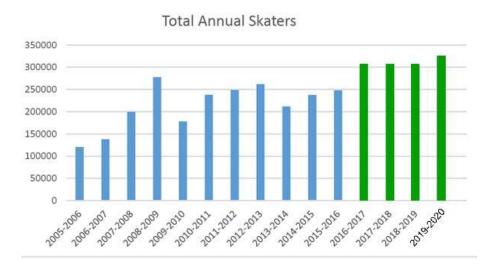

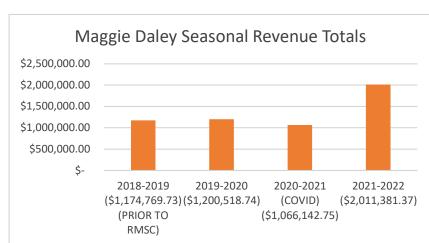


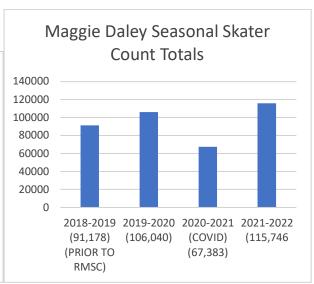




### Maggie Daley Skating Ribbon, Chicago, Il

## A. Details of deliverable materials, including type and age of equipment provided or vendor relationships for equipment to be purchased.

Rink Management Services will provide a ticketing software system for Glass City Ice Skating Trail. Rink Management Services also has working relationships with multiple companies to assist in any purchase or rental of equipment that may be needed for the facility. Rink Management has top ratings with vendors such as The Zamboni Company, Jackson Ice Skates (Skate Rental Vendor), Becker Arena Products and others.

### B. Submit a proposed operating plan for the Glass City Ice Trail and Pond based on design plans provided.

The Glass City Ice Skating Trail will be professionally managed by the largest ice-skating rink operator in the United States. All employees will be Rink Management Services Corporation employees and not affiliated with Metroparks Toledo.

Our onsite team will include an On-Site General Manager, Shift Managers/Ice Resurfacers, Admissions, Skate Rental, and Skate Hosts. Depending on the customer attendance Rink Management will ensure that proper staffing levels are created and scheduled appropriately and ensure our budget will be monitored during the process. With having our Mid-West Office within 30 miles from the site our Regional Manager, Louis Lombardo, will make frequent visits to the site to ensure proper operations.

Rink Management Services has always considered top-quality maintenance and operations of a facility to be a primary goal, dedicated to keeping the facility clean, stocked, and running well. As new managers, we will bring in third-party preventive maintenance companies to ensure that all equipment is working properly. Relationships with plumbers, HVAC companies, and others will be developed. All RMSC-managed facilities are well maintained and groomed. Our Management Team will work to make sure the facility is always clean, and all equipment is maintained to the top standards.
